



Instructions

REPLACEMENT OF EXPIRING EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS AND OPERATION LEVY

The Board of Directors of Newport Consolidated Joint School District No. 26-056 adopted Resolution No. 02-2022-2023, concerning a proposition to maintain current educational programs and operation. The proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, in place of an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, for support of the District's General Fund educational programs and operation expenses:

REPLACEMENT EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS AND OPERATION LEVY

The Board of Directors of Cusick School District No. 59 adopted Resolution No. 2022/2023 #1, concerning a proposition to finance educational programs and operation expenses. This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, replacing an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, for educational programs and operation expenses not funded by the State:

REPLACEMENT OF EXPIRING EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS AND OPERATION LEVY

The Board of Directors of Selkirk School District No. 70 adopted Resolution No. 22-23/01, concerning a proposition to finance educational programs and operation expenses. This proposition would authorize the District to meet the educational needs of its students by levying the following excess taxes, in place of an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, for support of the District's educational programs and operation expenses not funded by the State of Washington:

2024	\$2.25	\$720,000

Special Election - Proposition #1

PERMANENT LEVY LID LIFT TO FUND FIRE OPERATIONS

The Board of Commissioners of Pend Oreille County Fire District No. 2 adopted Resolution 22-10 concerning an increase to its regular property tax levy. This proposition authorizes the District to increase its regular property tax levy to \$1.00 per \$1,000 of assessed value for collection in 2024. The funds will maintain normal operations and increased staffing of district stations. The maximum allowable levy in 2024 shall serve as the base for subsequent levy limitations as provided by chapter 84.55 RCW.
