

If approved, this proposition shall fund fire and emergency medical services as stated in the pre-annexation agreement with Pend Oreille Fire District #4. This proposition authorizes a 2017 regular property tax rate increase of \$1.17 per \$1,000 for a total estimated levy rate of \$3.51 per \$1000 assessed value. The 2017 levy amount shall be used to calculate the subsequent levy limits.
